

Choosing a realtime reporter



CaseViewNet is the most advanced and flexible realtime interaction technology available. In its most basic form, CaseViewNet will accept realtime input from any realtime reporter. But, coupled with a licensed provider, the real power of CaseViewNet is unleashed.

There are two means of connecting CaseViewNet to a court reporter's realtime system and here's what you can expect from the court reporter you choose:

Serial Connection: CaseViewNet will receive a serial feed from *any* realtime reporter using the same serial cables, splitters, adapters and Bluetooth adapters used with other realtime viewers such as CaseView II[®], LiveNote[®], and Summation[®]. The majority of CaseViewNet features are available with this type of connection including marking, annotating, assigning issue codes, searching for Questions, Answers, and keywords and, of course, the amazing Dynamic Index which automatically builds on the fly.



Network Connection: To get the most from CaseViewNet, be sure to request a licensed CaseViewNet reporter. In addition to all the features associated with a serial feed, the network protocol allows for three additional and critical features not available in other realtime viewers:



1. **Ease of set-up:** Forget the serial cables, adapters, and drivers associated with other programs. Here you'll set-up simply by joining the network, just like you would at a hotel, airport or Starbucks[®]. It couldn't be easier or faster to connect and the file is secured with the highest level of encryption.
2. **Transcript continually refreshed:** Receive the court reporter's edits on the fly! Your realtime transcript will refresh automatically and instantly as the court reporter edits the transcript throughout the day. The accuracy of the transcript improves all day long and leaves you at the end of the day with the most up-to-date file possible.
3. **Join late and get everything you missed:** Arrived late? Don't worry. Not only will you be able to easily connect to the reporter with minimal disruption of the proceeding, your CaseViewNet viewer will instantly be populated with everything you missed including edits the reporter has made along the way!

Special Note: If you'd like to take advantage of the ease and features associated with CaseViewNet but your firm has standardized on another litigation support program, don't worry. You have the best of both worlds. Receive your realtime in CaseViewNet and use it for marking, annotating, and assigning issue codes in realtime. Then simply use the "Save As" functionality to save the file in formats such as TextMap[®], LiveNote[®], Summation[®], and the like. Email it to your staff and all your work in CaseViewNet will appear when opened in the other program!

Steps to schedule a reporter for realtime with CaseViewNet:

1. Contact your preferred court reporter or court reporting agency. Inform the person scheduling that you would like a realtime reporter for CaseViewNet.
2. Use the "serial" and "network" information above to specify the type of realtime reporter you would like sent to the deposition (remember, CaseViewNet will receive input from any reporter... it's the features desired that make the difference).
3. Make sure the attorneys have the latest version of CaseViewNet on the computers they will be using. The free software is available for immediate download at www.caseviewnet.com.
